JULY MEETING

In July, our topic was "911 in Salt Lake County." Mr. Terry Ingram, the director of the Valley Emergency Communications Center was our guest speaker. Mr. Ingram explained that the VECC was established three years ago as a public entity with responsibility handling public safety dispatch and records services for its seven member organizations including: Midvale, Murray, Sandy, South Jordan, West Jordan, West Valley and Salt Lake County Fire as well as for some other jurisdictions. centers goals are 1) provide cost effective service, 2) promote inter agency ccoperation and 3) enhance crime analysis capability. explained that VECC is governed by an operations board which is made up representatives from police and fire departments of each jurisdiction, and a political body comprised of elected officials from each

jurisdiction. There are three dispatch centers serving the Salt Lake Valley, VECC, Salt Lake County Sheriff and Salt Lake City.

Mr. Ingram traced the history of 911 (Basic 911) which has been around for a time. He explained the old process of 911 call takers interviewing caller to obtain the necessary information, then manually routing the call to the appropriate jurisdiction where they most likely had interview caller again. Terry related some of the problems in obtaining information from young children, visitors and hysterical callers.

Mr. Ingram then discussed E911 (Extended 911) which came online immediately after the opening of VECC. He indicated that utilizing automatic number identification (ANI) and automatic line identification (ALI) capabilities, emergency 911 calls were routed to Seattle

where critical billing information obtained that allowed the call to be immediately routed to the appropriate dispatcher as well as display the name, address and telephone number on the call takers screen. All of this takes only fraction of a second from the time 911 is dialed until displays on the call takers screen. bad response time, wish our system were that fast.) indicated that emergency units could now begin to "roll" immediately receipt of the call, saving precious seconds or minutes which can make the difference between life and death.

Following Mr. Ingrams presentation, supervisory personnel conducted tours and explained the operation of facility. I think most people attended this presentation were impressed with herculean task putting this center together as well

the high level technology they are using.
