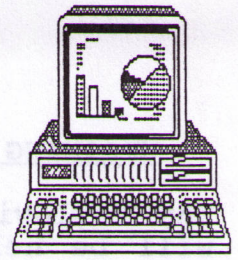

## SEPT. MEETING

Richard Langford from Cognos Corporation gave a presentation on Fourth Generation Languages. Richard started his presentation by describing a 4GL in general and some of the philosophy behind fourth generation languages. He explained that as languages are developed, the first thing to come along after the language are utility type products. Then the code generators arrive next. Last come the fourth generation language type products. These are last because they are the most complex. In the traditional development cycle, about 80 - 90 percent of the time is spent maintaining an application and the costs associated with maintenance are not identified up front.

With a fourth generation language, the user becomes more involved in describing, documenting and developing the

application. Thus the user is more satisfied with the end result. 4GLs lend themselves to a business environment. They should be able to coexist with existing software applications and take care of 60 - 70 percent of the details in developing new applications.

One of the concerns of developers when looking at a 4GL is that they tend to run less efficiently than native code. Richard explained that this used to be the case. The execution efficiency has been greatly improved. When using a 4GL we may trade some execution efficiency for development and maintenance efficiency.

Richard feels that 4GLs are the way of the future. Cognos Corporation markets a product called PowerHouse. If you would like more information on PowerHouse, I am sure Richard would be more than happy to hear from you. Just give him a call at: 801-
