## APRIL MEETING

Charlie Fox, Disaster Planning Coordinator for First Security Bank, shared some general ideas on disaster/recovery planning at our April

meeting. The highlights were:

1. It should be a 'Business Recovery' plan, rather than just an MIS plan. Senior Management must be involved. 2. The plan should include all departments, each responsible for their own portion of the plan. 3. The plan SHOULD BE PRACTICAL - NO OVERKILL. Remember that it will not be 'Business as usual' in the event of a disaster. You may have to maintain minimal services. 4. Types of potential disasters in our area include: Natural earthquakes, weather, flood, fire, etc.; Man-made - aging buildings, loss of electricity, fire, water, hazardous materials, loss of key people, disgruntled employees, construction accidents, airplane crashes, etc.; Political - Strikes (couriers, critical vendors, security), riots and terrorists. 5. Determine which

records should be kept, and how long. 6. Decide on the priorities for each computer application. Which ones really need to be up right away? For some, that may depend on the time of month or year, ie, monthend, yearend, etc. 7. Don't forget to include PC and LAN based applications in your plan. 8. Determine how long your company could be 'down'. Many companies would be totally out of business in three days. Consider outage of varying durations. Short: less than 24 hours, Medium: 1 to 5 days, Long: more than 5 days. 9. The details of the plan are proprietary, but the fact that a plan exists may be made public to assure customers, clients, etc., that your business is safe and prepared. 10. Keep a copy of the plan in at least one off-site location. 11. Consider who you should send to the backup site in the event of a disaster. Some people may be hard pressed to leave home, family or maybe even their Corvette. 12. Be sure to take

backups off-site.

Keeping a backup copy next to the computer will not be much good if the computer area is destroyed. 13. Use auditors to 'nudge' management in an effort to get support for the plan. They can be a big asset. 14. Have a company spokesman. Don't let employees start jabbering to the press in the event of a disaster. 15. The plan should be 'exercised' at least 1 to 4 times a year, depending on your situation.
