August Meeting Highlights



We had a panel featuring four members of our user group discuss their experiences with preparation, implementation, and post implementation of OS/400 V3R1. Their experiences seemed to be very

positive. The panel members and a brief synopsis of their comments are as follows:

Blaine Holmes of SMS

Took about 9 hours to install V3R1 on a D80, not including backup time. He had a problem with ILE/C which was fixed by applying a PTF. He also experienced problems with a line dropping on their dial-up communications but it seemed to correct itself when the machine was IPLed. Blaine noticed lots of damaged objects, many of which were fixed by reclaiming them.

Terrell Thomas of CR England Trucking

On a model 320 their install took about 3 hours and then another 3.5 hours to apply PTFs and re-IPL. Terrell had some problems with logical files which were resolved by removing authority. He had some problems with communications and had to apply 3 PTFs to correct it. He encouraged users to PLAN for the install by reading the Software Installation Guide and other publications ahead of time. Terrell said to be sure you add a few hours of 'cushion' when installing. He also discouraged people from loading BookManager unless they have lots of disk space. He advised users to contact their other software and hardware vendors to avoid installation and post installation compatibility problems. He also mentioned to be sure to load all licensed programs then display the tape and software resources for comparison after installing V3R1.

Jeff Walker of I-O Corporation

Jeff advised people to get a good backup before installing V3R1. He said his disk usage went up by 5% and added that you may want to remove double-byte character sets if you don't need them. During his install his Work Station Controller locked up. He suggested getting the Client Access/400 diskettes and installing rather than upgrading. Jeff also mentioned to be sure and specify on your software order how you want the SoftCopy documentation - either on CD-ROM or tape. The default is tape.

Gary Larson of Lagoon Corporation

His install of V3R1 on a model E35 took about 13 hours. His biggest problems were with Client Access/400 and could only clear them up after installing a great number of PTFs. Gary mentioned that configuring PCs on the network was complicated and time consuming. He encouraged people to use the FORUM/400 on-line service from IBM to keep up-to-date on the latest tips. He mentioned that the install of the new FSIOP network server card took only 2 hours and went smoothly. He found he had to increase his machine pool size by 2 meg.

General Suggestions/Comments:

• Display the V3R1 tape (or any IBM tape) BEFORE you install to make sure your tape drive will read it OK. If your tape drive head is out of alignment you can read

and write your own tapes, but you may not be able to read a tape created on another machine.

- Fix any memory and DASD problems (disk space) BEFORE moving to V3R1.
- The July CUMM tape seems to help a lot with performance.
- ILE compile times are longer than 'normal' compiles.
- TCP/IP everything is considered a virtual device.
- File transfer time and save times seem to be faster with V3R1

Nice job guys! We really appreciate their participation on the panel.
