Our guest speaker was Dave Phillips, VP and General Manager of KUTV Channel 2. Dave described the circuitous route that brought him to his current position. After obtaining an undergraduate degree from the University of California at Berkeley, he then entered law school. However, he had a side business of restoring cars. One day an entrepreneur that he had done business with asked him to help build a mobile communications van for television broadcasting. Shortly thereafter one of his vans was used by a TV station to get live coverage of a natural disaster that had occurred in the Sierra Mountains. Soon thereafter a TV station came to him and offered him a job to build and maintain a mobile communications van for them.

Dave worked his way up through the technician and engineering ranks at Bay Area TV stations, and finally had the opportunity to get into station management. This was unusual since most station managers come from the marketing and sales side of the broadcasting business. He was able to make this transition by always trying to learn things outside his daily responsibilities ("outside the box") and gain knowledge and expertise in other areas which made him more valuable to his employer and allowed him to advance in his career.

Dave Phillips came to Salt Lake City as part of the network affiliation swap between KSL and KUTV last summer. He is in the process of upgrading the equipment and facilities at KUTV. Dave sees that broadcasting will eventually be linked to the Internet. People will one day be able to see the full news copy and footage on the Internet of stories that air on the news that may have only been briefly mentioned during the news broadcast. New technology in transmitting TV signals will soon allow for 'narrow casting', which would enable a TV station to give more personalized newscasts to various regions around the state (such as news for Provo, Ogden or St. George).

## AS/400 Tips and Techniques

Q: I have an AS/400 with disk space at 95 percent capacity. A new disk is on the way, but any suggestions about how to free up some space in the meantime?

**A:** Try the following recommendations to gain more possibly a lot more - hard disk space:

 Run the WRKF (Work with Files) command to search for all files in library QSYS that fit generic name QHST\* (system history log) and then delete all but two or three of the most recent QHST\* files.

- Run the WRKPRB (Work with Problems) command to list all problem logs and then delete all unnecessary logs.
- Run GO CLEANUP, select option 1, and choose the appropriate cleanup options for your installation.
- Run the RCLSTG (Reclaim Storage) command to reclaim storage wasted by damaged objects, objects without an owner, objects not in a library, and so on. This command can take hours to run (and it can't be run in batch), but executing it is an absolute must.
- Apply PTFs permanently because temporarily applied PTFs eat up DASD. Until a PTF is applied permanently, the system has to keep two copies of the code affected by the PTF.
- Use RGZPFM (Reorganize Physical File Member) command to reorganize database files that contain many deleted records.
- Run GO LICPGM to deinstall unnecessary IBM licensed programs. For example, you may have the S/36 environment installed even if you don't use it.
- If you use OfficeVision, run the RCLDLO (Reclaim Document Library Object) command to reclaim document storage.
- Run CPROBJ (Compress Object) command on objects (such as programs or panel groups) that are rarely used but that must be on the system in case someone needs them.
