On June 4th IBM announced OS/400 V3R2. We were pleased to have Robin

**Van Wagenen**, our local AS/400 specialist from IBM, come and give us an overview of the announcement and what it means to us.

The new version of the operating system includes a wide array of enhancements - too many to list in their entirety here. Three major portions of the enhancements are:

 <u>Internet Connection for AS/400</u> - transforms the AS/400 into a Web server, allows you to send any of your existing applications on the Internet - without rewriting or translating those programs.

- <u>Integration of Lotus Notes</u> allows users to easily communicate with colleagues and customers, collaborate in teams and coordinate strategic business processes.
- <u>Security</u> more built-in security features to protect against hackers and viruses unlike other platforms where security is an add-on feature. OS/400 now qualifies for the C2 Level Security Designation.

Some of the other enhancements of note are:

- New Windows 95 client for Client Access
- New tools for Data Warehousing
- C++ run-time support
- Year 2000 support
- Enhanced print support with Print Services Facility, PrintSuite
- System management enhancements with SystemView System Manager, OMEGAMON, Backup and Recovery, Job Scheduler

## AS/400 Tips and Techniques

Q: How can I spell-check database character fields? Is there an OS/400 API that can check the spelling of a string?

**A:** API QTWCHKSP spell-checks one or more words for you, and API QTWAIDSP returns a list of words similarly spelled. You use QTWCHKSP to determine whether a word is spelled correctly, and if it isn't, you use QTWAIDSP to list possible replacements.

Both APIs require language dictionaries to be installed on your system; a language dictionary exists for each national language that IBM Supports. To find the language dictionaries installed on your system, enter GO LICPGM from any command line and choose option 10 from the menu. The licensed program product number for the

language dictionary depends on which OS/400 release you run

For example, if you have OS/400 V3, when you enter GO LICPGM and choose option 10, you get 5763DCT. When you select 5763DCT, you can scroll through the list to find the U.S. English dictionary, which is the last one listed.
