# **August Meeting**

Last month **Gerald Nichols** of *Vitrex Corporation* introduced us to ILE RPG. This month he will expand the topic by teaching us about the **Integrated Language Environment (ILE)** of which ILE RPG is only a part. ILE is a new programming environment that includes the new ILE family of compilers. That family includes ILE RPG/400, ILE COBOL/400, ILE C/400, and ILE CL.

ILE offers many benefits over previous program models. Those benefits include binding, modularity, reusable components, common run-time services, coexistence, and a source debugger. They also include better control over resources, better control over language interactions, better code optimization, a better environment for C, and a foundation for the future.

Gerald will delve into the mysteries of ILE to help us understand how this new programming environment will help us improve our application development.

Our meeting this month will be held on Wednesday, August 14th at 11:00 a.m. at the Murray City Offices (City Council Chambers), 5025 South State Street.

# **July Meeting Highlights**

As mentioned above, Gerald Nichols introduced us to **ILE RPG** in our July meeting. He did a great job teaching us what was new with RPG and wetting our appetites to begin using it. The new RPG has much to offer over the old RPG. You may wonder why we need a new RPG in the first place. Some of the reasons are:

- Reformat and simplify the RPG specs
- Raise or remove language limits
- Add new features
- Improve existing features
- Allow RPG into the ILE world
- Position for future changes

Some of the key changes made to the language are:

- 1. Wider columns for new limits
- 2. Keyword notations
- 3. Limited free-format specs
- 4. New Definitions (D) specifications

- 5. Support for new DATE and TIME data types
- 6. Pointer support
- 7. New built in functions
- 8. Names 10 characters long
- 9. Larger numbers (30 decimal places)
- 10. Larger arrays (32767 elements)
- 11. Mixed case characters for readability
- 12. Underscore (\_) allowed in field names
- 13. Blank lines allowed

Gerald explained many of the new features of the Header Specification, File Specification, Definition Specification, Input Specification, and Calculation Specification. He also discussed what it takes to migrate from RPG III to RPG IV and what is coming in the future of RPG.

Our thanks go to Gerald for a job well done. He was well prepared and knew his stuff. And to our surprise the mild mannered Mr. Nichols showed us he has a sense of humor too! Thanks.

# **User Group Member Featured in Midrange Computing**

One of our own user group members, **Dale Simpson**, was featured in the July issue of *Midrange Computing* magazine. Dale is the MIS manager of **LDS Foundation** which works in support of Brigham Young University (BYU) to solicit contributions from the university's alumni. The two page article, found on pages 18-19, described Dale's positive experience with migrating from an AS/400 E50 to the new AS/400 Advanced Server 50S.

The article begins, "Dale Simpson was no longer fully satisfied with his AS/400 E50. For one thing, he fretted about the 700,000-entry database that was straining the system's capacities. The database, he knew, was like a perpetual adolescent -- it would do nothing but grow. The

## AS/400 Tips and Techniques

Q: How can I use the OPNQRYF (Open Query File) command to select records based on a part of an externally described character field?

**A:** Let's suppose you need to extract from your INVENTORY file all items that have the characters 0025 in positions 4 through 7 of the item number field. This would retrieved items such as 30-0025-01, 67-0025-AB, and so on. You can do this search with the following statement:

OPNQRYF FILE((INVENTORY)) +
QRYSLT('%SST(ITMNBR 4 4) +
\*EQ "0025"')

The QRYSLT parameter value sets up the selection string to use the %SST (substring) function to extract four bytes (starting at the fourth byte) from the ITMNBR field. QRYSLT then compares those four bytes to the string "0025".
