AS/400 Tips and Techniques

Tracking Tape Read/Write Errors

Q: Does the AS/400 keep track of the read/write errors on the tape volumes we use?

A: Yes, the system stores the error statistics for tape volumes in the machine error log. For each volume, the log contains statistics on temporary and permanent read/write errors and total kilobytes read and written. An example of the command to print out tape errors is:

PRTERRLOG TYPE(*VOLSTAT) VOLTYPE(9347)

MODEL(001)

The statistics accumulate over the life of the tape volume. If you want to reset the error information for each volume, include the keyword VOLSTAT(*DLT) in the PRTERRLOG command.
