September Meeting Highlights



We were honored to have our local AS/400 specialist, Robin Van Wagenen, speak to us at our September meeting about the new AS/400e series that were recently announced by IBM. Robin never

fails to dazzle us with her vast array of knowledge of the AS/400 and this presentation was no exception. With the new AS/400e models come many changes and new features. Some of these are:

- OS/400 Version 4 Release 1 now comes bundled with the new AS/400s. This means the price of the machine includes the price of the operating system - no more user-based pricing.
- New 8-CPU and 12-CPU servers now boast processing speeds up to 4.6 times faster than any previous AS/400s.
- Main memory of the high-end models was increased from 4GB to 20GB, and disk capacity was nearly doubled to 996GB.
- Prices for a single-processor AS/400e start at \$7,995. The 12-processor model costs up to \$1.25 million.

- e-Business Enablers such as Net.Data, Net.Commerce and Native Lotus Domino make it easy to create interactive web applications used for e-business.
- AS/400 integration of Windows NT Server on the Integrated PC Server allows full NT Server functions.

There are many more new functions and features - too many to list here. The AS/400e series is ready to go to work to help your company jump into the new world of e-business computing. We are grateful to Robin for taking the time to be with us.

AS/400 Tips and Techniques

Downloading Spool Files to a PC

Q: How can I download spool files to a PC using standard tools?

A: Use the AS/400 CPYSPLF (Copy Spool File) command to copy a spool file from an output queue into a physical file. You can then download that file to the PC using the Client Access file transfer function or any comparable third-party file transfer program. If you're running TCP/IP on your AS/400, you can even download it using File Transfer Protocol (FTP).
