Microsoft may have a lot to be thankful for, but must its customers celebrate a day early? When it comes to Thanksgiving, Microsoft's Outlook 97 has a problem with the very year for which it's named. Ask the calendar to display holidays, and Thanksgiving Day



shows up on Wednesday this year, rather than the usual last Thursday in November.

Outlook also celebrates Wednesday Thanksgivings in 1998, 2000, 2002, 2004, and 2005. In 1999 and 2003, Turkey Day is scheduled for Tuesday. For 2006 and beyond, Outlook does not even hazard to guess.

AS/400 Tips and Techniques

Performance and Packed-Decimal Fields

Q: I've been told that the performance penalty associated with even-length packed-decimal fields is no longer an issue with newer releases of OS/400. Do you have up-to-date information on this situation? We are presently at V3R1 and will be migrating to a RISC system in a couple of months.

A: I'm not aware that the performance issue concerning oddversus even-length packed-decimal fields has gone away. If you were to look at the Internal Microprogrammed Interface instructions on both CISC and RISC machines, you'd see that both systems generate different code for odd-length and even-length packed-decimal fields, so it appears there is still additional overhead. However, it's rare that having an even-length packed-decimal field is a *real* issue. The amount of additional code the system must execute to handle even-length fields is minimal, and execution is extremely fast. Unless you have some very intense mathematical routines

being repeated in rapid succession, I wouldn't expect a noticeable impact when using even-length packed-decimal fields
