### **Undisputed Patent Champion**

IBM kept its patent attorneys busy last year, winning 1,724 patent awards from the Patent and Trademark Office – more than any other company.

In IBM's dust were Canon, with 1,378; NEC with 1,095; and Motorola, with 1,058. IBM has topped the list of patent award winners for five years in a row.

Two of IBM's most remarkable '97 patents: a method for reading data from multiple layers of an optical disk, greatly increasing storage capacity; and network-savvy antivirus technology that's modeled on the human immune system.

Still, 1996 remains IBM's record year, when the company won a stunning 1,867 patents.

#### Notes Moves To AS/400

IBM and its Lotus Development Corp. subsidiary this month will bolster the Domino groupware server with native support for the AS/400 platform.

Domino, the server side of Lotus' popular Notes groupware system, will run natively on the AS/400e Series and AS/400 Advanced Series models, which are equipped with 64-bit PowerPC RISC processors.

Native Domino support for AS/400 is slated to be available next month. Officials at Lotus, in Cambridge, Mass., would not disclose pricing.
