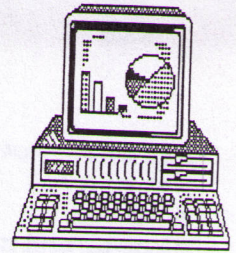

AUG. MEETING

Robin Van Wagenen started our meeting with a presentation on CallPath/400. This innovative software allows you to integrate voice functions with a wide range of AS/400 applications ... from order processing and claims inquiry ... to market research and fund-raising ... to help desk and emergency services.

CallPath/400 provides an application programming interface (API), which allows applications to integrate functions and information from a variety of telephone systems. You can use CallPath/400 to add voice capabilities to existing AS/400 applications or to create entirely new applications.

Jennifer Myers then did a presentation on imaging on the AS/400. Image processing

allows you to store, retrieve, and manage documents electronically within your organization. These imaged documents can either be scanned into the system or brought into the system from other data sources. The image system then becomes a central repository to reference information. Image on the AS/400 is provided in the Workfolder Application Facility/400 product. This product not only allows the storage and retrieval of documents, but also the management of those documents. WAF/400 also allows interfaces to other applications, so data could be passed/updated from a data application.

Image processing provides both tangible and intangible benefits. Some of the tangible benefits include: storage space savings, reduced costs in supplies, micrographic equipment, labor/time savings, reduced need for copies, etc. Some of the intangible benefits are: improved productivity, loss avoidance, better organization, improved customer service and opportunities to reengineer work process.

Following Jennifer's presentation, Robin presented Facsimile Support/400. IBM Facsimile Support/400 is a programming enabler which allows integration of facsimile transmission easily and directly into a software application. Basic support for sending and receiving facsimiles to or from an AS/400 using industry standard Group 3 facsimile service is provided.

Use of Facsimile Support/400 enhances productivity. Information to be faxed no longer needs to be printed and taken to a fax machine. Facsimile output can be initiated from any terminal attached to the AS/400 system or from an application program.

Facsimile support is easily integrated into existing applications through control language commands.
