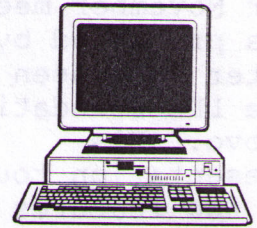
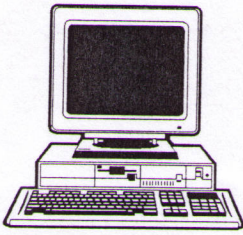

TIP

Recently I got message "CPC8C06, PTF order complete. No service number assigned." This message was the result of requesting too many PTFs at one time. The default when requesting PTFs via ECS is to send the PTFs electronically. If the PTFs are too large, the above message may be generated. This problem can be avoided by changing the default on the SNDPTFORD command with the following command: CHGCMDDFT SNDPTFORD DELIVERY(*ANY). This change will allow the PTFs to be sent on tape if they are too large to send electronically.

Service Director is available to customers who's AS/400 is currently under warranty or covered by a maintenance agreement with IBM.

As part of the Service Director offering, you get FORUM/400. FORUM/400 is an application that is fast becoming an electronic service provider for AS/400 systems and users.
