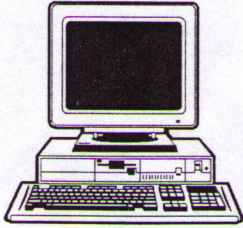

JANUARY

Our January meeting was presented by Boyd Bellows from Sherwood Digital - I-O Corporation. Boyd talked about IPDS printing and some alternatives.

IPDS has several "towers" or modules:
Graphics - the electronic merging of text and graphics (charts, logos, signatures, etc.) on the same page.
Bar Codes - generation of all

current bar code types.

Forms Overlay - electronic forms generation printed on plain paper with variable data merged in.

Text - regular text printing.

Security & Error Recovery - byte by byte status of print jobs is available to the host for error recovery purposes.

The advantages of using AFP/IPDS printing are: compatibility, security and error recovery and one stop solutions.

The disadvantages are: cost, overhead, compatibility and lack of flexibility.

There is a variety of inexpensive, reliable, proven alternatives to AFP/IPDS. Look at all your options before making your decision as to what is best for your situation.
