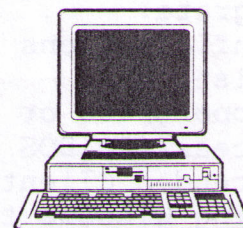
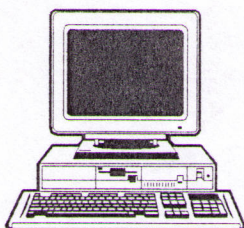

APRIL

Our April meeting was held at 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, April 12th, 1995.

Marvin Boothe from IBM did a great job of covering the Windows 3.1 client for Client Access/400. Here are some of the highlights from Marvin's presentation and the handout he distributed. The following are included with Client Access/400 for Windows 3.1:

* A migration utility to allow you to migrate configurations from existing PC Support/400 or Client Access/400 DOS Extended Clients using Windows to Client Access/400.

* A PC console feature allows you to use your PC as the system console.

* System Object Access (SOA) permits access to printers, spooled files, jobs, job logs, and messages using graphical user interfaces.

* IBM Ultimedia Mail/400 provides a full-function client E-Mail solution with a graphical interface.

* IBM AnyMail/400 allows the AS/400 to be used as a mail server for PC mail/office products.

* It is a native Windows client, written to minimize the use terminate-stay-resident (TSR) programs (except for the device drivers). Instead of using 60-90K of DOS conventional memory in a PC Support/400 DOS Extended twinax connection environment, the new Windows client would use no DOS conventional memory. It is also easier to install, configure, and use.

* Supports the use of the new Integrated File System which provides improved access to data and better performance.

* An Enhanced Open Database Connectivity (ODBC) Level 2 driver is included.

* Supports TCP/IP networks. Better security includes checking for expired passwords at the communications layer and encrypting passwords on the network.
